

## Domain names

The domain names area allows you to configure your domain from WizMailer. Hosting your domain with WizMailer refers to going to your domain registrar, and changing your nameservers to point at WizMailer (ns.mailanyone.net, ns2.mailanyone.net, ns3.mailanyone.net, ns4.mailanyone.net, ). If you do not wish to host your domain with WizMailer you can simply point your MX record to mx.mailanyone.net.

## Hosting your domain elsewhere

If you host your domain elsewhere, you will only use this section to add your domain to the list of domains associated with your account. Go to Settings -> Domain Names -> Add A Domain.

Enter your domain in the domain name field. Do not check the host DNS option or custom webmail login as those will only work if your domain is hosted with us.

## Hosting your domain


If you wish to have WizMailer host your domain, the steps are similar. Go to Settings-> Domain Names -> Add a Domain.

Enter your domain name, check “Host DNS” and click the “Add Domain” button. You also have the option of clicking “Enable custom webmail login website.” This will create a webmail subdomain (webmail.yourdomain.com) that will allow you to login to webmail.

After you do this, you will have the option of linking your website to your domain. If you know the IP address of your site, select “Link this domain to a website” in the drop-down menu and click “Go to Step #2.”
